Hosted by the Department of State Growth through Skills Tasmania, these awards set the gold standard for vocational education and training in Tasmania.

With a proud history that dates back to 1949 when Stewart Ingles, a carpenter from the North West coast was awarded the first Apprentice of the Year, the event is now a highlight of the training sector calendar.

This year's winners will be announced at a gala dinner on Friday, 6 September 2024 at the Hotel Grand Chancellor, Launceston for over 400 guests from the training, business and industry sectors.

Award categories

Sponsors of the individual award and organisation award categories will have exclusive naming rights to one or more of the following awards.

Individual award categories \$5,000 each				
Apprentice of the Year*	Presented to an individual who is undertaking an apprenticeship and has been outstanding in all aspects of their training.			
Trainee of the Year*	Presented to an individual who is undertaking a traineeship and has been outstanding in all aspects of their training.			
Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year*	This award recognises the achievement of an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student who is undertaking an apprenticeship, traineeship or a course of study leading to national qualification, and who has been outstanding in all aspects of their training.			
Vocational Student of the Year*	This award recognises an outstanding student's achievement in a course of study leading to a nationally recognised qualification.			
VET Teacher/Trainer of the Year*	Presented to a vocational education and training (VET) teacher or trainer who demonstrates innovation and excellence in providing nationally recognised training to students at a registered training organisation (RTO), or in partnership with an RTO.			
School-based Apprentice/Trainee of the Year*	Presented to a student who is undertaking a Certificate II or above qualification as a school-based apprentice/trainee. The Award recognises the student's commitment to their formal studies at school and in the workplace.			
VET in Schools Student of the Year	Presented to a full-time year 10, 11 or 12 student undertaking an accredited vocational education and training (VET) course that has a vocational placement component. The award recognises the student's commitment to their formal studies and their VET course.			
Equity Apprentice/Trainee of the Year	Presented to an apprentice/trainee who overcomes significant barriers or disadvantage to undertaking their vocational education and training qualification.			
Equity Vocational Student of the Year	Presented to a vocational student who overcomes significant barriers or disadvantage to undertaking a vocational education and training course.

There are no national equivalents to the VET in Schools Student Award, Equity Apprentice/Trainee Award and Equity Vocational Student Award.

Organisation award categories \$5,000 each				
Small Employer of the Year	Presented to a small enterprise that employs 99 or fewer full-time equivalent employees and has achieved excellence in the provision of nationally recognised training to its employees.			
Employer of the Year	Presented to an enterprise that employs 100 or more full time equivalent employees and has achieved excellence in the provision of nationally recognised training to its employees.			
Small Training Provider of the Year	Presented to a registered training organisation with fewer than 500 students that demonstrates excellence and high level performance in all aspects of vocational education and training.			
Large Training Provider of the Year	Presented to a registered training organisation with 500 or more students that demonstrates excellence and high level performance in all aspects of vocational education and training.			
Industry Collaboration Award	Presented to the parties of an exemplary skills development collaboration between industry and the vocational education and training sector. Collaboration must be between at least one employer/industry body and at least one registered training organisation who delivers nationally recognised vocational education and training.
