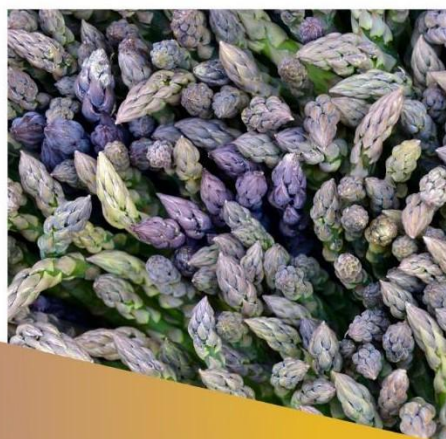
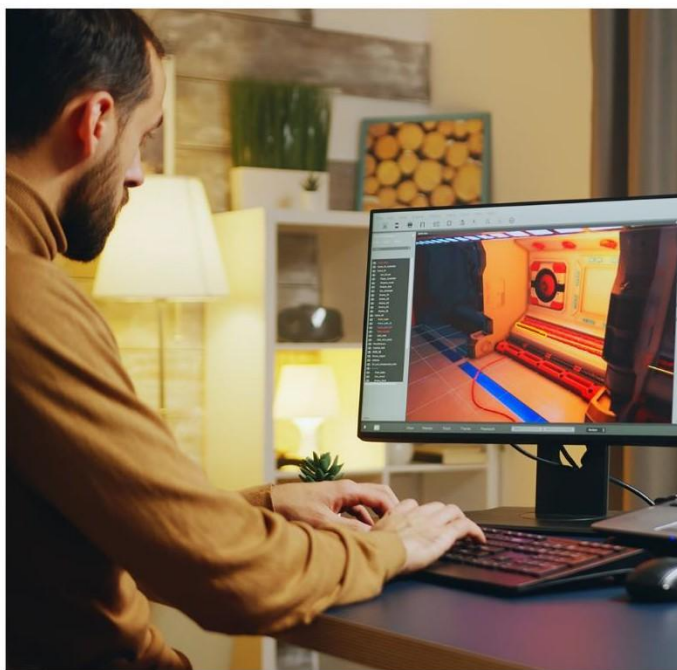


# Snapshot of Training Needs

A snapshot of government funding priorities to inform Skills Tasmania's contestable grant funding programs

September 2025



# Snapshot of Training Needs 2025

This Snapshot of Training Needs identifies current Government priorities for subsidised Vocational Education and Training (VET) in Tasmania and summarises what Skills Tasmania has heard from stakeholders (including through Industry Skills Compacts) about Tasmanian industry and learner needs.

Skills Tasmania will use this Snapshot as a reference when assessing applications for contestable grant programs. It is updated each year to coincide with the release of the Building a Skilled Workforce Program – the Existing Worker Fund and Jobseeker Fund grant rounds.

For 2025-26 grant rounds, the Snapshot is supported by a Government Funded Priority Courses list (Appendix 1). The published list is not exhaustive and is intended to be used as a guide by Registered Training Organisations when applying for subsidies through Skills Tasmania grant programs. Other related or comparable courses that meet the intent of the Government Funded Priority Courses List Policy Statement may be considered as priorities.

## Skills for Jobs

- Feedback from industry and training providers identifies issues with **attracting and retaining vocational trainers and assessors**. There is demand in many industries to increase the quality and quantity of supervisors and trainers. This demand includes an opportunity for more people from industry to work as trainers in a part-time or casual capacity, and to explore skills sets as alternatives to full qualifications. Vocational trainers and assessors are critical to training delivery across all sectors. Skills Tasmania will support the training of more vocational trainers and assessors as a high priority.
- The **Health Care and Social Assistance** industry is the largest employing industry in Tasmania, employing 46,357 people as of May 2025<sup>i</sup>. It is also experiencing the fastest employment growth of all industries in Tasmania, with growth of 8.3% predicted between 2024 and 2027. It is projected that Tasmania's Health Care and Social Assistance industry will require 6,378 new workers between now and 2027, more than any other industry in Tasmania. Workers in this sector are predominantly female (79%<sup>[iii]</sup>). Many of the jobs in this sector are heavily reliant on VET and require participants with the right capabilities and attributes to work with individuals, children and families.

Under Education and Care Services national regulations at least 50 per cent of educators in early education centres must be qualified at Diploma level or higher, all other educators must be qualified at Certificate III level, and transitions to Diploma level qualifications are encouraged<sup>i</sup>.

Significant reform is underway in the disability sector and there continues to be significant workforce challenges, including increasing opportunities for people with disability and supporting quality disability service delivery.<sup>i</sup>

The most significant occupations likely to experience growth in total new workers requiring training <sup>[iii]</sup> in this industry in Tasmania are:

- aged and disabled carers (will require an additional 1,218 workers by 2027)
- welfare support workers (228 new workers)
- nursing support and personal care workers (207 new workers)
- early childhood educators (115 new workers – Child Carers occupation).

Skills Tasmania will support training in this sector as a high priority. There is an opportunity to increase apprenticeships and trainees in this sector.

There are increasing demand for short courses or specific units targeted at emerging workforce needs and learner adaptations to support a diverse learner cohort.

- Tasmania's **construction** sector is the fourth largest employing sector in Tasmania (as of May 2025) with 24,317 workers and is projected to grow by 2.8 per cent in the two years to 30 June 2027<sup>iii</sup>. Tasmania's infrastructure pipeline to 2033 is predicted to surpass \$25 billion [iv], providing the construction sector with certainty for years to come.

In the year to February 2024, 1,100 workers entered the industry who were previously not employed<sup>vi</sup>.

Most workers in building and construction are either studying or already have relevant qualifications. Of young workers employed in building and construction, 28 per cent hold a relevant qualification, which is high when compared to the average of 19 per cent across all industries combined<sup>vii</sup>.

The sector has a focus on encouraging inclusion and diversity, particularly for women in construction. The industry is a crucial employer of young people and people transitioning back into the workforce, highlighting the importance of pathway training that prepares people to work on construction sites. Incorporating new technologies and contemporary equipment and resources are important in training for this sector, as is offering flexible training delivery and innovative models for industry experts to support training delivery. This industry is traditionally a heavy user of apprenticeships and traineeships and Skills Tasmania continues to support those pathways.

- The **Tasmanian energy sector** is investing heavily in decarbonisation and clean energy sources with projects in the pipeline such as Marinus Link and Robbins Island Wind Farm along with the establishment of Tasmania's Green Hydrogen Hub. Meeting our renewable energy target requires rapid investment in renewables, creating high demand for skilled workers to build the necessary infrastructure. The newly established Tasmanian Clean Energy Centre of Excellence will partner with industry and have a dedicated focus on clean energy skills.

Opportunities exist in delivering clean energy training and attracting young Tasmanians to the sector<sup>viii</sup>.

- *ABS Labour Force Survey data for Tasmania show that electricians continued to be a high growth occupation with 2,570 employed in that occupation between May 24 and May 25<sup>x</sup>.*
- The Jobs and Skills Council for this sector, Powering Skills Australia, note in their Workforce Plan 2024 a shortfall of 42,900 energy sector workers nationally by 2030, and a need for 22,000 electrical apprentices (boosting apprentices in training by 40%) to meet this demand across Australia<sup>x</sup>.

Skills Tasmania will support training that builds skills in supporting Tasmania's focus on clean energy, including supporting existing industry workers to gain TAE qualifications.

- The **Accommodation and Food Services** sector is experiencing some employment growth (4.1% to 2027<sup>[iii]</sup>) and has high needs for training in job readiness and industry leadership. This sector has a strong preference for short courses and skill sets over full qualifications. Accommodation and Food Services is an important industry for young people entering the workforce.
  - 3,100 workers entered the industry who were previously not employed (in the year to February 2025)<sup>vi</sup>.

- Jobs and Skills Australia report that various occupations, such as chefs, pastry cooks and hotel or motel managers, are in shortage in this industry in Tasmania<sup>xi</sup>.
- **Manufacturing** supports numerous supply chains throughout Tasmania, underpinning thousands of jobs in other sectors including services and primary production. Due to the size, importance, and skill intensive nature of the industry, and the typical number of new and untrained workers entering, training will remain a critical input, particularly for advanced manufacturing firms in the coming years. Agile and innovative training programs are needed to ensure the sector has the skilled people to manage current and rapidly emerging technological changes<sup>xii</sup>.  
The most significant VET-related occupations in Tasmania are food and drink factory workers (1,297 persons employed), structural steel and welding trades workers (1,289 persons), and metal fitters and machinists (863 workers)<sup>iii</sup>.
- Tasmania's **agriculture industry** is highly diversified in terms of the range of products produced in different regional locations. Developing flexible and innovative training and delivery methods, particularly for regional and rural areas, will be important in enabling the sector to meet its skills needs. Skill sets continue to be valued in this sector<sup>xiii</sup>. Supporting and maintaining high productivity will require a highly skilled workforce that is proficient with new technologies, including automation, remote sensing and drones.
- The Tasmanian **forestry sector** encompasses native forest and plantation resource (softwood and hardwood), and the production of logs, woodchips, hardwood and softwood sawn timber, pulp and paper, veneer, fuel wood and other wood products. The forestry industry continues to experience shortages of new workers, a contributing factor to this is limited access to training and training providers. There is a need for clearer and more accessible training and recruitment pathways, including apprenticeships and traineeships.
- The **seafood industry** is committed to building economically successful, environmentally responsible, socially beneficial and sustainable businesses. A key strategic pathway for the sector is to build a diverse and skilled workforce and to improve the capacity, capability and professionalism of new workforce entrants. There is also a strong push to inspire young people to consider careers in seafood through early education and outreach.

The regional and remote location of much of the work undertaken in the aquaculture sector presents challenges in attracting and retaining workers, particularly when expansion requires an immediate increase in the number of workers. Given the physical nature of the work and challenging conditions working on the water, it can also be difficult attracting people to specific roles.

Another key issue is existing low levels of language, literacy and numeracy skills in the workforce and the increasing demand for digital literacy skills as the sector expands its use of technology and automation. Skills Tasmania will be looking to support learners' literacy, numeracy, and digital literacy skills within related qualifications.

Training must be adaptable and tailored to the specific needs of seafood businesses, including small operators.

- Due to retirement pressures from an ageing workforce (over 50% are aged over 50 [iii]), a high number of new workers are expected for agriculture, forestry and fishing in the coming years.



- The **information, communication and technology sector** is experiencing steady growth of 3.8% with 375 additional workers expected to be required in the industry by 2027 [iii]. Skills and training in artificial intelligence, cyber security, cloud computing and user experience design are in significant demand in Tasmania and technical skill gaps are emerging in multiple areas. The industry is keen to develop and promote entry level and career transition training pathways into and through the sector<sup>xiv</sup>.
  - ABS Labour Force data shows that in Tasmania ICT Managers, ICT Support Technicians and Business and Systems Analysts have some of the highest occupation growth, with combined employment in selected ICT occupations growing 100 per cent, (over 3,000 employees), between May 2024 and May 2025<sup>ix</sup>.
  - In 2024, over 40% of government-funded enrolments in this sector were apprentices and trainees. There is an opportunity for this proportion to increase. Adapting courses quickly to emerging technologies and industry needs is essential to ensure graduates are as productive as possible.
- Servicing an island state, the **transport and logistics sector** is a key player in the Tasmanian economy, facilitating growth and exports in the sectors of construction, agriculture and aquaculture. The industry is experiencing considerable workforce challenges such as an ageing workforce, a shortage of heavy vehicle drivers and constrained access to local training and education providers. Key training needs include training for supervisors and peers in mental and physical health support strategies, in addition to key licensing, safety and productivity programs<sup>xv</sup>.

The Transport and Logistics industry has an estimated 37 per cent of workers aged 50 or over, and only 20 per cent of the workforce is female [iii].

- Continued access to a highly skilled and flexible workforce is a strategic priority for the **mining and minerals industry**. Digital and smart technologies are playing a critical role in product and service design along with production and downstream processes. Simulators are critical and have proven their investment not only in the training of workers, but also in attracting younger workers to the industry. Industry is keen to investigate pre-employment courses to address issues such as literacy and numeracy, basic safety skills and entry-level mining skills<sup>xvi</sup>.
- The **automotive sector** is a key part of the energy transition, requiring new skills and training in renewables and electric vehicle servicing and maintenance for tradespeople and apprentices. Industry requires learners to gain experience, education and skills on contemporary equipment and technology, with access to appropriate learning and assessment resources, and ensuring learners have gained competence and suitability for working in the industry.

## Supporting learners to succeed

- **Pre-employment and work readiness skills** remain a priority, and an essential pathway between school and work. Language, literacy, numeracy and digital literacy are required, particularly for jobseekers or those wanting to change careers at entry level, as are basic safety and work ready skills. Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) are encouraged to work collaboratively with the Tasmanian Government's Jobs Hubs to identify specific learner cohorts and their needs, including women in non-traditional roles and migrants.
- Training for Tasmanians living in **regional and remote communities** remains a priority. This includes supporting school leavers who want to train and work in their home region, as well as older workers who may need to upskill or reskill in response to emerging job opportunities in regions.

- Skills Tasmania is looking for RTOs that can provide:
  - Structured environments that provide mentoring and support for learners, and workplace supervisors with the skills and knowledge needed to support quality training outcomes.
  - RTOs with a flexible approach to customised training, who can provide responsive and adaptable products that align with industry needs to support effective training outcomes.

The Snapshot of Training Needs is intended as a reference for RTOs applying for contestable funding programs. It will be updated as needed.
